## **Presbyterian Corner**



Why Do We Have Offerings? That's a question we hear often. In the Reformed stream of churches (of which Covenant-First is joyfully a part) our worship flow moves from gathering to praise, to the Scripture lesson and then thanksgiving response - our "offering". Stewardship of life is an important part of our heritage and the offering reminds us that we are to give ourselves as an offering to God. Romans 12:1 teaches us "to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." Passing the plate for our financial gifts is a symbol of our sacrificial offering to God of our time, gifts, finances, daily life, even prayer, which the Bible says rise to heaven as a sacrificial offering

like incense in the Tabernacle of the Old Testament (Psalm 141:2 and Revelation 5:8). Though much our member's financial giving happens through checks in the mail, bank transfers and electronic deposits, the act of financial giving is our way of remember to be faithful stewards of all our life as we walk with Jesus.

### Looking Ahead



During the weeks of September and a few of October we will continue our look at the Letter to the Philippians. Today is a beautiful hymn sung in the early first-century church — Philippians 2:5-11. Jesus' life is held up for our example of faithful living. Chapter 3 is Apostle Paul's faith autobiography and chapter 4 is a goodbye and "I hope to see you soon" conclusion. Our take away from Paul is that his life was immersed in the Gospel of God revealed in Jesus . . . and may this be our spiritual growing edge.
